• Supervised Teaching Practice

Practice Teaching is a learning process that provides experiences to student teachers for development of their competence. To improve skills in teaching, the students are required to undertake pre-planned teaching under the supervision of Teacher-Educators. Every student teacher will be required to present 40 model lessons 20 in each teaching subject. The specific objectives of the practice teaching are

- A. To develop skills and capabilities for effective teaching and learning.
- B. To develop positive attitude towards teaching as a profession, and a broad outlook and open mindedness towards educational innovations.
- C. To develop effective monitoring and supervision.

Session of micro-teaching is organized to size feed back and a change to improve the teaching skills in each and every student.

A week long Block teaching is given to expose the pupil teachers about practical management and school organization.

Timely guests Lectures, Seminars, Group Discussion, Workshop in different subject are organized for exchange of knowledge.

Scheme of B.Ed Two Years Examination

The B.Ed. (Two Years) will consist of the following components;

Part I - Main Theory papers at B.Ed. Part I & Part II

Part II - School internship of 20 Weeks (10 at B.Ed Part I & 10 at B.Ed Part II)

In B.Ed Part - I Paper No. 01, 02, 03 and 07 a/b are of three hours carrying 100 Marks (80 for Theory) + 20 sessional each. Paper 04, 05, 06 a and EPC - 1 & 2 are of 2 hours each carrying 50 Marks (35 Theory + 15 sessional) each.

In B.Ed Part - II Paper 07 a/b, 09 & 11 are of 3 hours carrying 100 Marks (80 for theory + 20 for sessional) each. Paper 06 b, 08 10 and EPC 4 are of two hours carrying 50 marks (35 theory + 15 sessional) each. EPC-3 in part II carry 100 marks out of which 50 marks will be allotted for practical and 50 Marks for theory. EPC-3 theory paper will be of two hours.

Paper 12 SUPW Camp/open air session will be totally internal. It has five components of 100 Marks and not less than three days shall be devoted for it by the institution.

Practical/Internship part will be divided in both the years and it will carry 450 Marks.
